Friday 6th October - Jane de Gruchy - (SW Heritage Trust) – Tales from the Quarter Sessions - Somerset's Criminal Past.

Friday 3rd November - Steve George - The Life and Times of Cardinal Wolsey

Friday 1st December - Dan Broadbent – **The Quantock Landscape Partnership Scheme** has been running a wide range of historic heritage projects across the Quantock Hills since 2020, including heritage conservation work; LiDAR interpretation; archive research and an extensive programme of community archaeology. Dan Broadbent is the scheme's Historic Heritage Officer and will be sharing details of the project's progress to date, along with plans for the future. Included in the talk will be reports on the discovery of a late Bronze Age enclosure, the search for a 'lost 'medieval manor, an update on the recent findings from an interesting henge site and much more.

Programme 2024

Friday 5th January - Members evening – all welcome.

Friday 2nd February – Tim Hall talking about **Outdoor Music Making in Somerset** ranging through ancient horns to village bands, folk noise, militia bands, drummers, rough music, and much more. Tim will also bring along some musical instruments.

Friday 1st March - Liz Caldwell of Mick Aston Young Archaeologists Group (MAYA) talking about **Mick Aston**, **Julian Richards and Phil Harding** and past excavations along with the practical fieldwork carried out.

Friday 5th April - Wessex Archaeology - Life and Death in Roman Somerton. Wessex Archaeology was commissioned by <u>BAM Construction Ltd</u> to undertake an archaeological excavation on the outskirts of Somerton, ahead of construction work for a primary school. Work was carried out in 2019/2020. Most notably, ancient burials unearthed on the <u>Somerset County Council</u>-owned land have shed significant light on life and death in Roman Somerset. Preliminary results have revealed a sequence of past human activity spanning around 1500 years, from the late Bronze Age to the end of the Romano British Period.
